The proshop product range has also been expanded as we test the ability to sell other products, once again made possible with the extra display space. All members are reminded that all profits from the bar and proshop go directly to your club so all purchases make a direct contribution to the clubs finances.

Communications

The preferred communication with members is via newsletter and facebook. All members are encouraged to like us on facebook as this is the most timely communication channel with constant posts of club activity. Further adding to these mediums we intend to upgrade the booking system and website early 2018 making them more compatible with phone technology. Expect to see an improved booking system introducing new functions like email reminders, peak time waiting list for cancelled bookings and online payments.

The iPad communication to above court TV's is a NZ first and has been very quickly embraced by all. Expect to see next year the conclusion to that technology as we do away with the push to talk speakers, with all communications to players coming direct from the iPads through the TV speakers. This is leading edge technology and we are leading the way both locally and internationally.



2017 has been a major milestone in the Club's history. With the building being a construction zone for a number of months, celebrating our 50 year anniversary and then hosting the World Junior Championships there has been plenty happening.

MEMBERSHIP

We continue to hold membership at over 600 placing us as the largest squash club in the country. With a steady stream of people moving to the area and a strong feed in from local schools we are lucky to have a ready source of new members. Membership demand is still strong despite having now been in this new location for 6 years. A huge percentage of new members are referred by existing members living up to the marketing adage that your best advertising is "word of mouth" - this certainly works for us.

2017 ACTIVITY

The ability to host the World Junior Championships was the highlight for the year and shows we are more than capable of hosting large world class squash events and expect this will give us confidence to further explore further squash opportunities. Huge thanks to members who worked with us during the alterations and then the lack of court access during the Championships. The finished alterations have been proven to be well designed and solved lots of minor operational problems we had, leaving us with an even better facility. Special thanks must be given to the funders who supported our vision and allowed the alterations to be completed. The funders were TECT, Lion Foundation and NZ Community Trust. Special mention must also be made of Bruce Matheson and ASPEC Construction who delivered a complicated demolition and rebuild all completed within a fully working squash club that was completed ahead of deadline.

PROSHOP & BAR

Both the bar and proshop are major income generators for the club and make a sizeable contribution to the bottom line. The introduction of craft beer has been exceptionally well received this year along with an expanded drink range through the extra display space.

Facilities

Despite having spent over \$300k on improvements this year, the Committee are constantly looking to improve your squash playing experience. Subject to funding, we are looking to convert the remaining 5 courts to LED lights. The CBK court was converted this year. The LED light is brighter and also brings plenty of power cost and maintenance benefits.

Following on the success of doubles squash we will also be exploring the possibility of converting the remaining 3 courts to moveable walls, giving us potentially 4 full size doubles courts. This is a particularly expensive exercise and will only be undertaken if funding can be secured – watch this space. Further on the horizon the Committee have settled on a master plan that potentially could see the installation of a full Glass Court. This is a major construction and is a medium to long term vision but gives us something to work toward. Draft plans are shown in the Facilities report later in this report.

Interclub

While the year was dominated by the World Juniors, and the Kitchen renovations, there were many other things worthy of recognition. Devoy had eight Men's and four Women's teams in the Autumn competition, and seven and three respectively in the Winter League. It's a tough competition to get through in BOP, and we managed to get our C Grade Men and E Grade Men through to Nationals. Both performed strongly and did well to both finish 3rd. A great effort, and good reward for all the training they put in.

Doubles

Doubles League was a revelation this year. It seems the word is finally getting out that this is a great format to play, and that our facilities are the best around. We currently have players travelling from across the Bay, and even Waikato to compete. The club is heaving on Tuesday nights, with no surprise that the Bar takings are well up. The burgers and chips are proving very popular now that we have the ability to offer fresh cooked food.

Business House

Business House has also been very well supported this year. Lots of new players, and a few higher graded players keeping everyone honest. Another great way to meet other players, have a drink or two, and sneak a bit of exercise in without realising you've done it. The Devoy Squash and Fitness Centre has had an extremely busy year, as will have been detailed in previous reports.

There have been large cash flows to accommodate this activity, but I am pleased to report that our effective cash position (current assets of bank and debtors less the current liabilities of creditors) is up on last year.

The Club was the major host of the World Junior Squash Championships and as such was in a position to obtain funds for a major upgrade of the facilities for the kitchen, bar and office areas and also to receive significant subsidies to purchase and install the electronic scoring system and associated TV screens on the courts. The building upgrade was more than the grants received but this was able to be met from the court hireage for the World Junior Squash Championships and reserves held.

During the Championships the Club also held the 50th Anniversary celebrations, which was subsidised by the Club, but was an event which could not be passed unnoticed.

The tournaments, events, coaching and other activities continue, and due to pre-planning are largely self-funded. This is not necessarily reflected in these financial statements as there in no allocation of running costs or additional income to each activity. The membership is near capacity and there are activities all year, so as long as this tendency continues the Club will continue to be in a strong viable financial position.

Snapshot

Gross Profit for 2017 was \$263,180 compared with \$244,697 in 2016.

Net Trading Surplus (before depreciation expense, grants and sundry income) was \$90,573 compared with \$66,645 in 2016.

Net Assets increased to \$2,016,888 from \$1,722,882. This was mainly the building upgrade.

Statement of Financial Performance

Membership revenue, advertising and sponsorship increased. The proshop and bar sales decreased, possibly due to the rebuilding and time out for the World Junior Squash Championships. Costs remained consistent with the prior year, with the exception of administration support Contractor Fees. There are number of regular expenses for power, interest, insurance, computer use and security which must be met each month.

The club contributed to the costs for the team competing for the Cousins Shield. A worthwhile investment as they were victorious.



FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Statement of Financial Position

The net cash position is \$103,643 which is down on the cash position of \$129,462 last year due to capital expenditure during the year.

Stock has increased considerably due to the space available. Proshop \$28,903 compared with \$20,579 and bar \$3,977 compared with \$3,136.

The building had additional costs of \$306,723 and the equipment \$8,139 for the ipads and TVs (half the full price contributed by the World Junior Squash organisation) and \$5,170 for the Water Cooler. All of which are wonderful assets for the club.

Events after Balance Sheet

Since Balance Date there have been the purchases of a new refrigerator for the kitchen, furniture for the lounge and a cabinet for the office.

There are no other specific costs expected after balance date.

Club stage 1 upgrade:

The first half of this year saw a huge effort from a large number of people, as we raced to get the planned Stage 1 upgrade completed in time for the World Juniors. With a new commercial kitchen, a new bar complete with walk in back-loading fridge, extended lounge area and reconfigured admin area, the end result looks great and most importantly works well and will serve the club well for the future. At the same time, we took the opportunity to install a new above court electronic marking system linked to lpads, a new water cooler and replaced all the damaged ceiling tiles.

A big thank you to all those involved and also to members for your patience while the work was being carried out. Generous funding from TECT, NZ Community Trust and Lion Foundation made the project possible, and support from our partner, Tauranga Boys College.

More recently you will have noticed new couches and tables in the lounge area, replacing the old red chairs which came with us from the old club – along with a lot of old members!

Lighting:

The next project we have planned is to fundraise to complete replacement of all the court lighting with LED lighting. This will improve the lighting quality, and importantly reduce our operational costs as the lights last longer and cost less to run. Subject to fundraising we aim to complete this next year.



Future projects:

The committee continues to strategically plan for the future and ensure improvements are part of an overall building master plan. The next phase, Stage 2, is to build upon the huge interest in doubles squash and install moveable walls on the MacMurdo and Artisan courts which will then give us the capability of having 4 full sized doubles courts. Twice the fun!! All going well with fundraising we hope to install these early in 2019 during the quieter summer months. Stage 3, which would complete the current master-plan, is the provision of a glass exhibition court. Any decision on this is some way off and will first involve extensive consultation with members and Tauranga Boys College.

World Junior Squash Championships

World Junior Squash Championships



Event Overview



- The annual World Junior Squash Championships comprises three events featuring both men's and women's junior individual events which take place together; followed by a Junior Team Championship which alternates between Men's and Women's.
- Organisation took nearly 2 years of planning.
- Staffing was primarily a volunteer workforce consisting of an Organising Committee, a paid Championship Director, a contracted Event Logistics Manager and Marketing & Communications Manager, and over 150 volunteers to run the actual event.
- Dame Susan Devoy officially opened the World Championships. "It's a real opportunity and privilege to play in your home town, some of my favourite memories were in 1987 when we hosted the world champs in Auckland. I'm just glad there weren't so many talented Egyptians, Malaysians and so on around then, I would never have stood a chance!"
- The Championships were held in four venues: Queen Elizabeth Youth Centre (QEYC) which was the main showcase for the event featuring the all-glass court and seating for up to 1000 spectators; the Devoy Squash & Fitness Centre; Mount Squash Club and Te Puke Squash Club.
- Players were accommodated at the Trinity Wharf Hotel and Armitage Hotel with transport loops between all the venues.
- A host of international referees officiated the Championships. There were also talent scouts here for a shopping spree of top junior players to attend Universities on squash scholarships.
- Entry was free to the three host clubs with a gold coin entry to the Queen Elizabeth Youth Centre. The aim was to make this an affordable family event.
- A slick range of merchandise was offered including hoodies, tees, training jerseys and caps.
- Squash New Zealand re-established itself as a prominent World Squash host and venue, with Kiwi's doing well and performing on home soil and introducing new sponsors and the community to the sport.
